CORNELL JOURNAL OF LAW AND PUBLIC POLICY PUBLICATION ETHICS STATEMENT

The Cornell Journal of Law and Public Policy (JLPP) is committed to a high standard of excellence and ethics. In order to go about maintaining a high ethical standard JLPP expects the utmost ethical behavior from editors, authors, and publishers.

I. EDITORS

Editors on JLPP are held to the highest standards of professionalism and ethics and are accountable for everything that is published in JLPP. Some of the duties of Editors on JLPP include:

- Selecting what to publish articles and notes that are of greatest academic merit while performing reasonable diligence to ensure that the articles and notes selected are factually correct and not misleading.
- Balancing publishing selections on the article or note's importance, relevance, originality, clarity, thoughtfulness, and completeness.
- Ensuring an unbiased selection process in which Editors will recuse themselves from the selection process if a substantial bias between the Editor and author or the Editor and the topic of the author's work exists.
- Maintaining a standard of confidentiality in which the editorial staff of JLPP will not disclose information about a submitted article or note to anyone other than the article or note's respective author, reviewers, faculty advisors, the publisher, and other JLPP Editors.
- Maintaining an open dialogue with authors during the editing stage of publication to ensure that the author is accepting of any recommended changes JLPP makes.



II. AUTHORS

Authors who wish to submit for publication in JLPP are expected to submit original work that has not already been published elsewhere. In addition an author is expected to be

- Thoughtful and respectful when incorporating non-original ideas into the Author's submitted work, which includes proper citations to the original work.
- Mindful and responsive to comments made by Editors during the publication process.

III. PUBLISHERS
